Pumpkin Book Character Contest 2023

It's Harvest Time! Let's enjoy a crop of sweet stories and share our bounty with others!

In celebration of National Book Month this October and the arrival of fall, all Salt Brook Elementary School students in grades K-6 will have the option to participate in a festive book project. With books and pumpkins everywhere this season, students are encouraged to share their harvest in a creative way! All interested students are invited to decorate a pumpkin or gourd as one of their favorite fictional book characters. This year the decorated pumpkins and gourds will be displayed both at school and virtually as part of a Salt Brook Storybook Pumpkin Patch Padlet! All pumpkins must be posted to the Padlet by Monday, October 30, 2023. Once the pumpkin has been posted to the padlet, the student may bring the pumpkin to school and put it on display. The winning pumpkins in each category will be announced and awarded a prize no later than Friday, November 3rd. Have Fun!



The task is simple:

- * Decide if you will enter as a STUDENT PUMPKIN, FRIEND PUMPKIN, or as a FAMILY PUMPKIN.
 - > <u>STUDENT</u> should be all/mostly done independently by the individual student, and will compete with other students in their grade level.
 - > <u>FRIEND PUMPKINS</u> may be done with no more than 4 Salt Brook friends working together on one pumpkin character, or a group of pumpkin characters. Friend group pumpkins will compete with other Friend group pumpkins.
 - ➤ <u>FAMILY PUMPKINS</u> may be done as a family with students and parents working together on one pumpkin character, or a group of pumpkin characters. Family pumpkins will compete with other family pumpkins.
- You may use a real pumpkin or gourd, or a craft pumpkin or gourd of any size.
 - > Individual student and Friend Group pumpkins being entered by grade level may NOT be carved.
 - > Family pumpkins may be carved with the help of an adult.
- Select and decorate a pumpkin/s or gourd/s as a favorite fictional book character/s.
- * To decorate, use materials such as: paint, googly eyes, yarn, felt, feathers, construction paper, pipe cleaners, fabric, buttons, pompoms, wigs, props (glasses, jewelry, crowns, etc.).
 - ➤ Tips:
 - Do not paint an entire fresh pumpkin, as it will spoil too fast. Leave the bottom unpainted.
 - Permanent markers or acrylic paint work best. Watercolors tend to just smear.
 - Embellishments like hats, hair, mustaches, glasses, and jewelry add life-like qualities.
- Pumpkins MUST be posted to the Salt Brook Storybook Pumpkin Patch Padlet 2023.

 - > In the "Title" of the Padlet:
 - Include first name/s, and the first letter of each student's last name, and homeroom
 - Family Pumpkins should include the Family Last Name and the homeroom of one of the students
 - > In the "Write something ..." section add the following details:
 - Include Book Title/Author
 - Include name/s of the book character/s

- * Post a photo of the pumpkin (Include the book in the photo with the pumpkin, if available).
- * Bring the Pumpkin to SB and put it on display for all to enjoy!
