I have provided a list of supplies that students will need to help them create their art. We may not use all the supplies at once but they will be important to have. This will also be helpful for projects that need to be completed at home. If students are in group A or B, ideally they should have one set in school and one for home. If anyone is unable to obtain these supplies please let me know. Some items may already be on their class list.

**The list includes:**

A Pair of scissors

Pencil

Eraser

Black sharpie (fine point)

Crayons

Markers

Glue stick

Watercolor set

Oil pastels

\*Colored pencils

\* Black Sharpie (Ultra fine point) or black ball point pen

\*White paper for drawing (for at home only)

\*A variety of colored paper (for at home only)

I will be able to provide paper to students at school in groups A and B.

Please note that a family can share these supplies at home, but **each student will need them in school on the day they have art.**

These items can be purchased as a kit from Nasco for \$24.95 and includes all supplies listed except the last 4 items\* highlighted in blue. The items can also be purchased separately based on your individual needs at stores like Michaels, Target, Amazon or other retailers.
